On the day the children performed their routines for the six judges, whilst competing against 5 other schools, and after all the scores were added together we were announced as winners of the tournament.



COUNTY CHAMPIONS ONCE AGAIN

Last week our under 11's football team retained their title as Oxfordshire county champions, by winning the ESFA Small Schools' County Final. Having qualified for this event back in October, our team had to face three other schools from across Oxfordshire for the right to be named the best in the county. Our team got off to a great start and won the first game 1v0 against Kirtlington Primary, thanks to a fine finish from Finn E. A nil-nil draw with Sunningwell Primary in the next game meant their final match against Emmanuel Christian Primary would decide the winners of the tournament. After full and extra time, the teams could not be separated so the match had to be decided by penalties. With both teams knowing all of their hard work came down to this moment, the atmosphere was very tense but thanks to two sublime saves from Theo R, we won the penalty shoot-out 2v0. Our team will now travel to Bristol at the beginning of March to represent Oxfordshire in the South West Regional Finals for the chance to reach the National Finals.



UNDER 11'S LEAGUE RESULTS

Our Under 11's team have also been busy competing in the two leagues they are involved in this year. YEAR 5+6 ATHLETICS

Also last week, 24 of our Year 5/6 children attended the South Oxfordshire Indoor Athletics Tournament. After 30 various events ranging from team relays to javelin and triple jump, all the scores were added together and we were awarded the bronze medal for finishing in third place out of all nine schools, despite being the second smallest school taking part.



MOULSFORD KS1 TAG RUGBY TOURNAMENT

At the end of last month a number of our Class 1 and 2 children were invited to the Moulsoford Preparatory School tag rugby tournament. In the morning the children were given some excellent training from the Year 10 sports leaders of Piggott's School, before playing against most of the private schools in the area, in the afternoon.



This was the first experience of competitive rugby for a large proportion of our two teams and we were extremely pleased with how well they performed including taking points off a number of schools with much more experience of tag rugby than ourselves.

CRANFORD HOUSE KS1 FOOTBALL TOURNAMENT

A week later our KS1 and Foundation Stage pupils attended the Cranford House football tournament. Participating in this event were 15 teams from schools across the area.

Our Green/Blue team played superbly, especially considering that the team was made up of solely Year 1 and Foundation pupils who were competing against Year 2 teams, and made excellent progress from their first match to their last.

Our White team also competed in this event and after winning all of their group matches, including 2-0 wins over Moulsoford and Chandlings, they qualified for the semi-finals. In this match they faced Benson Primary and after the match finished 1-1 after extra time, we found ourselves facing the dreaded penalty shootout. After 3 penalties each, Benson had to score to remain in the match, but thanks to a superb save from Auryn we booked our place in the final.

St Mary's were our opponents in the final. Once again, after full and extra time, the teams could not be separated and penalties were required to decide the winners, and in what turned out to be a carbon copy of the semi, Auryn A was the hero once again, saving the crucial penalty to give us victory in this tournament for the second time in four years.



SOUTH WEST REGIONAL FINALS

At the beginning of March our Under 11's football team travelled to Bristol to represent Oxfordshire in the South West Regional Finals of the English Schools' FA football tournament, having been crowned county champions earlier this year.

On the day the children represented our school superbly, and won two, drew two and lost two, meaning they narrowly missed out on a place in the national finals.

Getting to this stage was a superb achievement for our school and the children should feel extremely proud of their achievements. We would also like to take this opportunity to thank the parents who attended on the day and supported our team so well.

UNDER 11'S OTHER RESULTS

Having returned from their trip to Bristol, our Under 11's team have been busy competing in various other tournaments.

As group winners we qualified for the quarter-finals of the VWHPSFA Small Schools' League and beat Blewbury School 5-1. This meant we faced current holders Appleton Primary in the semis, and in what was an exceptionally tight game, with both teams demonstrating a very high standard of football, neither team could be separated until 30 seconds before the end of extra time, when Appleton broke through and scored what proved to be the winning goal.



In the VWHPSFA Big Schools' League, our team narrowly missed out on a place in the semi-finals, after losing in a penalty shootout to Goring Primary School.

VWHPSFA SMALL SCHOOLS' 6-A-SIDE TOURNAMENT

Last week we took two teams to this event, for which we are current holders of this trophy. Our White team, which was made of mainly Year 4 and 5 pupils faced a difficult start against last year's runners up, John Blandy, and Lewis M was kept extremely busy making a number of superb saves but could not prevent us being narrowly beaten one-nil. In their next two games our team began to start showing their passing skills and were only denied victory in their last game by a late equaliser from Blewbury.

Our Red team got off to a great start and won 4 of their 5 group games without conceding a single goal. A subsequent two-nil win in the semi's meant that the final was a repeat of last year's match with us facing John Blandy once again. Unfortunately, luck was on John Blandy's side this time and we were beaten two-one.

GIRLS'S FOOTBALL TOURNAMENTS

This month we entered two girl's football teams into the VWHPSFA Girls' 6-a-side tournament. The first round was played at Ladygrove Park School in Didcot. Each team played three matches. Our 'B' team played fantastically in their first match with a convincing win of 3-0. However, they were unfortunate to lose the subsequent two games by just a goal each. Our 'A' team won two games and drew one which was enough to send them into the finals the following week.



The finals were held at 'Our Lady's Abingdon' and the team put on another excellent performance. We came up against some challenging opposition and unfortunately did not make it to the semi-finals. However, it was a credit to the team when several members of staff from other schools complimented us on our skill and team spirit.

LANGTREE CROSS COUNTRY TOURNAMENT

On Friday 2nd March, we took 4 teams of 6 pupils from Years 2-6 to the Langtree Partnership Cross Country tournament to compete against other schools in our partnership. This tournament involved the children competing as individuals and as a team, with the top 4 scores counting.

The first race saw our Year 3 and 4 girl's compete. The race was very competitive and Beth D finished in a very impressive second place, with 3 of our other runners finishing inside the top seven.

The next race saw our Year 3 and 4 boys take up the challenge of the 1km run and the boys also ran superbly, with 2 of our boys finishing inside the top 15.

The Year 5 and 6 girls race followed on from the standard set by our other girls team and also had 4 runners finish in the top seven, with Katie T-S taking second place.

In the final race our Year 5 and 6 boys completed the 1.2km race and 4 of our runners finished inside the top 10, with Finn E taking third place.
